Intro To Hand Applique (Starch & Freezer Paper Method) Student Supply List

Fabric:

(Note: please select fabrics other than batiks as they do **not** work the best with this method of applique.)

- Assorted scraps for flower pot, stems, leaves and flower shapes:
 - o flower pot approx. 6x8"
 - o stems approx. 12x12"
 - o leaves approx. 4x4" (4)
 - o heart, ovals and star approx 6" each
- 19" square of fabric for background of pillow top

Scissors:

- Fabric shears
- Small, sharp scissors for trimming fabric and snipping thread
- Paper scissors

Notions:

- Freezer paper a roll of Reynolds Freezer Paper (available in the laundry aisle at your grocery store) or sheets of quilters' freezer paper
- Thread in a neutral color or specific colors to match your fabric shapes Aurifil 50 wt works well. We will be discussing additional thread options as well.
- Clover 3/8" Bias Tape Maker (fusible version is fine)
- Fine point permanent marker for tracing applique shapes onto freezer paper (**ultra fine point** Sharpie works well)
- Niagara or Faultless aerosol spray starch or Magic Sizing Ironing Spray (again, available in the laundry aisle at your grocery store). Best Press is **not** sufficient for this method.
- Roxanne Glue-Baste-It (I like the 1-ounce Easy Squeeze bottle), or applique pins
- Your favorite needlework thimble
- Small ruler or seam gauge
- Fabric marking pen or pencil
- Tailor's awl or seam ripper
- Needle threader (Clover Desk Needle Threader or ultra fine needle threader)
- Reading glasses if needed ©

Ironing Supplies:

The Old Country Store classroom is well equipped with irons and ironing boards, but if you prefer to use an iron at your work station, feel free to bring a small iron and pressing board along for your personal use. I will have my favorite pressing boards available for sale.
