# Village Quilt Supply List

*Village* quilt pattern by Miss Rosie's Quilt Co. (available at The Old Country Store)

#### Fabric:

- 5" squares: If you are making the quilt pictured on the pattern (69 x 75-1/2"), you will need at least 297 5" Charm squares (a minimum of 8 Charm Packs) or the equivalent in scraps/yardage. Depending on the assortment of lights and darks, more Charm Packs may be necessary; more is always better. :)
- Background and Border: 3-1/2 4 yards of assorted fabrics or 3 yards of a single fabric

Binding: 3/4 yardBacking: 4-3/4 yards

### **Basic Sewing Kit:**

- Thread for machine piecing in a neutral shade to match your fabrics
- Fabric shears
- Thread snips or scissors
- Seam ripper
- Straight pins

#### **Rotary Cutting Supplies:**

- Rotary cutter with fresh blade
- Cutting mat (12 x 18" works well)
- Acrylic rulers:
  - o Deb Tucker's Wing Clipper ruler
  - o a 2-1/2 x 6" ruler is handy for cutting small pieces
  - o and, a ruler at least 8" long (4 x 14" is a nice size)
- Invisi-Grip or adhesive ruler grips (helpful in keeping your Wing Clipper and Fussy Cut ruler from sliding)

#### **Additional Supplies:**

- Best Press or your favorite spray starch or starch alternative
- Mini Design Boards consider making at least four 15 x 15" mini design boards. These boards make it easy to lay out your house blocks prior to stitching. If you are new to Lori Holt's mini design boards, the following "How to Make Lori Holt's Quilt Block Design Board Fat Quarter Shop" YouTube Tutorial will walk you through how to make them:

- Pressing mat and iron for your work station
- Clover Tailor's awl
- Small rotating cutting mat
- Stitch Supply Co.'s Fussy Cut ruler (for fussy cutting your house doors)
