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Quilting with your Embroidery Module Supply List

- Your sewing machine and embroidery module in good working order.
- User manual for your machine (Non-BERNINA machines).
- Machines hoops and the matching plastic templates.
- Machine needles suitable for the size thread you are using.
- Straight stitch throat plate, (optional, extremely helpful)
- Amelie Scott's book on Edge to Edge quilting. Available at Hinkletown Sewing and The Old Country Store.
- Amelie Scott's design pkg. Check again with Hinkletown Sewing.

IMPORTANT NOTE: Amelie Scott designs work well but they need to be rescaled to fit into the Bernina hoops. After you choose a design, **you will need to send me an email with the attached design so that I can rescale it for you before class. I will need to know which hoop you are using. We don't have time in class to rescale, as alignment points need to be checked.**

- Fabric marker – your choice in a color that works with your quilt – make sure it is a wash out marker!
- 6" x 12" or 24" ruler
- Basic sewing supplies
- Tape measure with metric
- Microtex needle size 80 & 90 (size 80 for lighter thread & size 90 for heavier threads OR titanium needles in the same sizes.
- Threads for embroidery "quilting". These could be lightweight threads such as Isacord, variegated Superior Rainbow, medium weight threads such as Mettler 50 wt cotton or heavier threads such as Superior King Tut. Top and bottom thread does not have to match!
- Something to quilt! This can be any size from wall hanging to large quilt. If you wish to do something small, and have no quilts prepared, a preprinted panel or quilt top will work. Layer 3 layers: backing, batting and top and pin baste layers together. Make sure you have extra batting and backing border extending about
- 2-4" beyond quilt top to make hooping easier. A small extra quilt sandwich to try out the thread and design.
- The design to the right is an overall design I created. If you would prefer this design to Amelie Scott designs, let me know. Cost: \$5
