

Lucy's Terrace Student Supply List

Pattern:

Lucy's Terrace Quilt pattern by Tales of Cloth. The pattern is available as a PDF download from the Tales of Cloth website. You'll have the option of purchasing just the pattern, or a kit with paper shapes and acrylic template. I would suggest ordering the PDF pattern only, unless you are OK with paying the Australian shipping rates for a paper pattern and/or kit. Click [here](#) for the ordering link.

English Paper Piecing Shapes:

You can either purchase pre-cut shapes, or use the printable templates included in the PDF pattern. If you wish to use the printable templates, simply print them out onto card stock and cut them apart. (I printed and cut my own.)

You will only need the honeycomb shapes for the day of class. The square shapes can be purchased later when you are ready to join your blocks or can be easily cut using a rotary cutter and card stock.

- Paper Shapes:
 - 1-1/4" Honeycombs, 590 pieces, or 24 for one block
 - 1-1/4" Squares, 144 pieces
 - 2-1/2" Squares, 17 pieces
 - 2-1/2" Half Square Triangles, 14 pieces (or you can cut these from your leftover 2-1/2" squares)
- Acrylic Template (for rotary cutting):
 - 1-1/4" Honeycomb with 3/8" seam allowance

Basic English Paper Piecing Supplies:

- Needles:
 - Milliner or Straw needle, size 9 for thread basting or tacking
 - Milliner or Straw needle, size 11 for whip stitching shapes together
- Thread:
 - Hand sewing thread for basting or tacking (I like to use a hand quilting thread.)
 - Superior Threads 60 weight Bottom Line polyester thread, or WonderFil 80 weight DecoBob thread in a neutral shade to match your fabrics for whip stitching
- Needle threader
- Fabric shears
- Small thread snips
- Paper punch for punching holes in the templates
- Sewline glue pen, if you prefer or want to try glue basting (I prefer thread tacking.)
- Clover Wonder Clips
- Reading glasses, if needed!

Additional Supplies:

- Rotary cutter
- Rotary cutting mat
- Rotary cutter ruler
- Two 15” Mini Design Boards – I like to lay my fabric pieces out on a mini design board as I’m working on them. If you aren’t familiar with them, click [here](#) for Lori Holt’s tutorial on how to make one.

Optional Supplies:

- Sue Daley’s Fussy Cutting Mirror
- Sue Daley’s Rotating Cutting Mat

Fabric Requirements:

This quilt uses optional fussy cutting techniques which makes yardage requirements tricky to calculate because the fabric needed depends on the size of the repeat and how many repeats you need! So, I would suggest purchasing enough fabrics for one block or bringing an assortment of fabrics along to play with in class. No need to purchase fabric for the joining squares for class; you can purchase that later.

Please refer to the pattern for more specifics on the fabric requirements.

Keep in mind that you can stitch just a few blocks for a pillow or table runner, or you can make this quilt any size you like!
