# Remixed Geese <br> Student Supply List 

## Pattern:

Remixed Geese by Erica Jackman of Kitchen Table Quilting. The pattern is available as a free PDF download from Robert Kauffman's website:

## Basic Sewing Kit:

- Fabric Shears
- Patchwork pins
- Thread snips
- Seam ripper
- Machine piecing thread in a neutral color to match your fabrics


## Rotary Cutting Supplies:

- Wing Clipper Ruler by Studio 180
- Omnigrid Invisigrip (cling film to prevent ruler from slipping)
- Rotary cutter with fresh blade
- Acrylic rulers; I like the following sizes:
- 6 " $\times 24$ "
- 4 " $\times 14$ "
- Cutting mat: 18 " x 24 " is a good size


## Additional Supplies:

- Frixion pen or fine tip marking pencil
- $1 / 2$ " marking ruler:
- Creative Grids 15 " Seam Guide Tool, OR
- Fons and Porter $1 / 4$ " Seam Marker, OR
- Studio 180 Quilters Magic Wand, OR
- Omnigrid 4", 6", and 12" Marking Ruler Trio


## Optional Supplies:

- Wooly Felted Wonders Pressing Bar and Clapper (the 12 " size is sufficient), OR The Strip Stick (Both items will allow you to press seams open more easily.)
- Spray starch, Best Press, Flatter, or your favorite starch alternative
- Clover Tailor's Awl
- Sandpaper board or a sheet of fine sand paper


## Sewing Machine, etc.:

- Sewing machine in working order
- $1 / 4$ " patchwork foot, if you have
- Sewing machine needles, size $80 / 12$ sharp or universal


## Fabric Requirements:

If you wish to make a quilt similar to the sample, simply follow the yardage amounts listed on the pattern.

Otherwise, you'll need an assortment of prints and/or solids. If you want it to be super scrappy, you'll need lots of different fabrics as listed below:

|  | Yardage Amount | How many |

|  | Fat quarter or $1 / 4$ yard | 26 |
| Solids: |  |  |
|  | $1-1 / 3$ yards | 1 |
|  | $1 / 3$ yard | 1 |
|  | $1 / 3$ yard | 2 |
|  | $1 / 4$ yard | 5 |

There's no need to have all your fabrics purchased in time for class. Simply bring an assortment to get started! You'll need one $7-1 / 2$ " square and four 4 " squares for each set of 4 flying geese units. You may wish to bring some extra fabric to practice with before cutting into your project fabrics.

## ***Important***

Feel free to cut your squares ahead of time, but keep in mind we will be cutting the smaller squares 4 " instead of $3-7 / 8$ " and the larger squares $\mathbf{7 - 1 / 2 "}$ instead of $7-1 / 4$ " as instructed in the pattern since we will be using the Wing Clipper ruler to trim down the flying geese units.
