

## The Holland Pouch Student Supply List

**Pattern:** You will need to purchase *The Holland Pouch* – available only as a PDF download from Center Street Quilts Etsy shop:

**Fabric & Notions:** as listed in pattern:

### Supply Requirements

	Small Pouch <small>6"W x 4"H x 4 1/2"D</small>	Medium Pouch <small>7"W x 5"H x 4 1/2"D</small>	Large Pouch <small>8"W x 6"H x 4 1/2"D</small>
Main Fabric*	Fat Quarter	Fat Quarter	Fat Quarter
Lining Fabric	Fat Quarter	Fat Quarter	Fat Quarter
Accent Fabric	Fat Quarter	Fat Quarter	Fat Quarter
Soft and Stable (1 piece) <u>or</u> Batting (2 pieces)	(1) 13" x 17" (Soft and Stable) <u>or</u> (2) 13" x 17" (batting)	(1) 15" x 19" (Soft and Stable) <u>or</u> (2) 15" x 19" (batting)	(1) 17" x 21" (Soft and Stable) <u>or</u> (2) 17" x 21" (batting)
Fusible Interfacing (such as Pellon SF101)	10" x 10" piece	10" x 10" piece	10" x 10" piece
Zipper	16" or longer	18" or longer	20" or longer

\* Directional prints may require more fabric. Turn to page 11 for instructions on using directional prints for the Main Fabric.

**Zipper info:** Be sure to select a zipper that can be shortened with scissors or a rotary cutter. Metal zippers or molded plastic parka zippers cannot be shortened. (Note: I used #5 zippers by the yard for my pouches.)

Also, I do **not** recommend using two layers of batting in place of the Soft & Stable (batting makes stitching the final bindings much more difficult!), so please be sure to purchase Soft & Stable.

#### Basic Sewing Kit

- Thread in neutral shade to match fabric: Aurifil 50 wt works well for machine quilting the body of the pouch, but I prefer a stronger thread for the actual bag construction. Superior So Fine or a polyester thread are good options.
- Strong Pins

- Heavy duty fabric shears
- Thread snips
- Seam ripper

### **Sewing Machine, etc.**

- Sewing machine in good working order
- Walking foot with guide bar
- 1/4" piecing foot
- zipper foot
- overcast foot or a foot that will allow you to stitch a zig zag stitch
- 90/14 Denim or Topstitch needle

### **Rotary Cutting Supplies**

- Rotary cutter
- Acrylic rulers - my favorite sizes:
  - 4" x 14"
  - 6" x 24"
- Cutting mat, 18" x 24" (optional)

### **Misc Tools & Notions**

- Clover Wonder Clips
- Clover Chaco Liner (white only!) or hera marker
- Clover Tailor's Awl or stiletto
- Small square acrylic ruler 2-1/2" or larger
- Marking pen or pencil

### **Optional Supplies:**

- Machine quilting gloves
- 1/2" bias tape maker
- 1/4" basting tape

### **Additional Notes:**

- Please cut your fabrics prior to class using the chart on p. 3 of the pattern. If you are using a directional print, you may want to wait until the day class for me to show you how to make that work.
- We will have plenty of time in class to do the walking foot quilting, but you are welcome to do that ahead of time if you wish.
