Fabric

- Scrap fabric in assorted colors to use on the Snowman, Santa and/or Poinsettia. I recommend
 assorted reds, blacks, flesh colors, white and green. A fat quarter is more than enough for
 several trivets.
- Insta-Bright I recommend having ¼ yard. But, if you plan on making a set of 4 you may need a bit more.
- Assorted color ribbon if going to hang your trivets

Stabilizer

• AquaMesh – wash away – I used OESD – I recommend bringing your roll.

Thread

Bring a variety of threads including red, white, green, black, yellow, orange, silver and pink

Bobbin Thread: - Seraline – please have bobbin thread prewound

Needles: - Embroidery 80/12 or Microtex 90/14. I recommend the Microtex 90/14.

Spray Adhesive: 505 preferred

Embroidery Machine: – bring your machine, module, cords foot control, etc.

Feet: - #26 (embroidery foot)

Hoop: - Large oval

Stitch plate: Single-hole 0mm (if you have it) or regular 9mm

Other:

Small old towel or drop cloth Temporary Marker or pencil

Thread snips Tweezers

Embroidery tape or painter's tape small and large ruler

Flash drive to load projects rotary cutter
Straight pins paper scissors
Fabric scissors seam ripper
