Vintage Table-topper Supply List

Fabric for the blocks:

*If you want to make your table-topper scrappy like the sample, you will need 16 different print fabrics. Cut each one at least 3 ½" by 4 ½". If you are new to paper-piecing you may want to cut them a little bigger (I cut mine 3 ¾" by 4 ¾".) The blocks will finish at 6" by 6".

Background: ½ yard of fabric, cut as follows:

*32 rectangles, cut the same size as your prints. You may also use a variety of prints instead of the same fabric for each block.

First border: 1 strip, ½" wide by the width of fabric.

Third border: 2 strips, 3" wide by the width of fabric.

Fabric for the second border: ½" of a print, cut in 2 strips that are 3" by the width of fabric. Purchase additional fabric if you would like to use it for the binding and backing as well.

Sewing machine in good working order.

Thread in a neutral color.

Basic sewing supplies: pins (extra fine or flat-head pins are recommended), scissors, etc.

Rotary Cutter

Glue stick or glue pen

Optional Supplies:

An index card, at least 3" by 5", or a small piece of template plastic.

Add-A-Quarter ruler

You will receive 4 foundation papers on the day of the class. Additional foundation papers may be purchased at The Old Country Store.

*A charm pack may also be used.
