

Class Supply List & "Jump Start" for Laser-cut applique Kits

Thank you for purchasing this Kit! and for signing up to take a class with me.

➤ What to bring to class

The obvious - your machine! Please, please know how to operate and thread it.

Machine should have a new needle, be oiled, cleaned, and ready to go.

Don't forget your power cord, foot pedal and your machine booklet.

And what else you ask? ☺

Extra machine needles (machine screwdrivers, etc to change parts & feet)

Extra bobbins (filled with threads you'll use in class - one bobbin for each color thread)

Threads to match ALL appliqué in kit, the background & outside border - yes, really. ☺

A walking foot AND free motion foot - (in fact, bring ALL your feet)

A Walking Foot



A Free-motion foot (open toe)
or called a darning foot
or appliqué foot.

505 basting spray (or safety pins if not using spray)

A small 4" appliqué scissors

Long straight pins with magnetic pin holder

Quilting gloves (very helpful)

Appliqué Pressing Sheet (or parchment paper)

Rotary Cutter (w/new blade, and having your own is preferable - one you know how to use)

Rulers (long, short, square)

Cutting Mat (18" x 24" or larger)

} These may be supplied or available to use at the shop.

} Please check with them before bringing your own.

You may also want to bring an extension cord, table lamp, travel iron, ironing pad. (check w/shop)

➤ Now let's talk about the KIT! ☺ ◀

So besides having the Kit with you, please also bring

Backing Fabric and Batting (See amount required on front cover of kit - don't forget them, you'll need them at the very start of class!)

Inside AND Outside Borders - Most of my Kits do NOT include these fabrics, so you must purchase some for your kit before coming to class - we WILL be adding them in class! - see front cover for required yardage)

The pre-fused, laser-cut appliqué

First, do NOT remove the paper backing from any shape! If you have extra time before class, here's what you may choose to do at home Carefully remove the pre-fused, laser-cut appliqué from the kit bag. Work with one color of shapes at a time. Turn shapes over to the PAPER side, and using a pencil, label the PAPER side of shapes with the matching part number, which you'll find on the appliqué pages of your pattern. If shapes are attached by "little bridges", you may snip the shapes apart at this time. NOW ➡ place the labeled shapes in smaller baggies according to their part number, NOT by color!

Example: place all "C" shapes in a "C" baggie; all "R" shapes in an "R" baggie, etc., etc.

Label all shapes - some may not have a part number, instead will have a part "name" - just label them as in they are in the pattern and place them back into the large kit bag.

That's it! If you do these things, you'll be teacher's pet! (especially if you bring chocolate)
