

Supply List

- Pattern download at the following link:

- Sewing machine with ¼” patchwork foot and a regular foot that will accommodate a zig zag stitch. The machine will need to be able to do a zig zag or blanket stitch.
- Thread to match your chosen fabrics
- Scissors, seam ripper
- Small scissors for trimming applique pieces
- Rotary cutter and ruler
- Sewing machine needle if using an OCS machine (universal 90/14 or what you have)
- Fabric that you need (read pattern instructions) Using fat quarters is your best bet for this project as most of the pieces are that size or smaller. I just used scraps from my stash but if you’re new to quilting you may not have a stash yet (Just wait)
- Extra fabric scraps—do not have to be the same as your project.
- Lightweight fusible web such as Heat n Bond light or Steam a Seam light (you need a yard or less of this. See your pattern for the size of the pieces that you’ll be tracing)
- Enough batting to cut a 19 ½ x 13 ½“ rectangle for **each place mat** you’re doing. Choose a thin batting, not a puffy one. The Old Country Store has “Batting Bits” which are remnants and would be perfect for this project.

Print out all the instructions even if you are doing only one placemat. They can be a little confusing as the pages are not numbered. When you have them all in front of you it will be easier to determine which ones you will be using. For example, if you want to do the EAT placemat you will have to search it out as the instructions do not show directions for it but DO include the letters and applique images.

If you’re confused, I will help you in class.

If you feel confident you may cut out your pieces before class. If not, we will go over that in class.
