Maker's Tote Supply List

- Maker's Tote Pattern by Noodlehead
  - If you are purchasing a PDF version of the pattern, please make sure you follow the printing instructions listed in the pattern so that the template prints to the correct size.
- Fabric requirements listed on the back of the pattern
  - $\circ$   $\ \ \,$  Quilting Cotton, linen and light canvas are great options
- Interfacing requirements listed on the back of the pattern
  - For this bag, I did not use the Foam Stabilizer, instead I replaced it with fusible fleece. This makes the bag softer, but it was easier to work with. You are welcome to choose either option.
- Zippers listed on the back of the pattern
  - I highly recommend using #5 zipper by the yard by Sallie Tomato as finding the required separating zipper can be challenging. We can make our own zipper lengths with the zipper by the yard to accommodate for not using a separating zipper. This zipper tape will also work for the back pocket zipper.
- Cotton/Poly Webbing 1" or 1 1/2" wide if you prefer to make webbing handles instead of fabric handles
- 1" Bias Tape Maker (useful, but not required)
- Coordinating Polyester Thread (there is some topstitching in this pattern on the exterior pieces and lining so think about what colors you would like to coordinate)
- Rotary cutter
- Small ruler
- Fabric Clips and Pins
- Seam Ripper
- Fabric scissors
- A small pair of sharp scissors with a point
- Fabric glue stick
- ByAnnies Basting Tape
- Tailors Chalk (if using dark fabrics)
- Disappearing ink pen for marking on fabric
- 90/14 sewing machine needle
- If you are bringing your sewing machine with you to use, please remember to bring your zipper foot attachment.

## Before Class:

- 1. Decide which size bag you will be making from the pattern
- 2. Please read through the pattern and gather supplies.
- 3. To ensure we have time to get through all the important techniques in this pattern, please have all of your fabric and interfacing pieces cut. Some of the pieces should be adhered before class. The main panel pieces will need interfacing after they have been sewn together so please wait to adhere those until the class.
