

Stitched Cards – Embroidery on Paper

Supply list:

Digitized Designs



- Before class, take a little time to explore the **OESD** website. In the search bar, type “**cards**” and enjoy browsing the many embroidery card designs available. Choose **three to four different card designs** that catch your eye and make you smile. Bringing a few options gives you flexibility and allows you to experiment, compare, and choose what feels just right once you’re in class.
If you’re unsure which designs to select, don’t worry—I’ll be happy to help guide you once we’re together.

Fabric

- Please bring several **6” x 8” fabric pieces** that coordinate with your chosen card designs. These fabrics will be used to finish the **inside of your cards**, giving them a clean, thoughtful look when opened and making each card feel complete and gift-worthy.

Cards

- Please purchase **blank cards and envelopes** for this project. Cards are available in **two sizes (small and large)**, so be sure you know which size you are buying **before** selecting your embroidery designs. Your design size should coordinate with your card size to ensure proper placement and fit.
- I purchased my cards from **Hobby Lobby** (Parklane brand), but you may use any similar blank cards you prefer.

Stabilizer

- Stabi Stick Tear Away – I recommend you bringing in your roll
- Fuse and Seal – I recommend bringing in your package of sheets

Thread

My samples were stitched with Isacord, though any good-quality embroidery thread you have at home will work beautifully.

Bobbin Thread: - Seraline – please have bobbin thread prewound

Needles: - Embroidery 80/12 or Microtex 90/14. *I recommend the Microtex 80/12.*

Embroidery Machine: – bring all items to make your machine work 😊

Feet: - #26 (embroidery foot)

Hoop: - large hoop

Stitch plate: Single hole 0mm (if you have it) or regular 9mm

Flash drive to load projects

Paper for taking notes

rotary cutter

Pinking shears
